Jury Awards Exergen \$14.6M in Patent Infringement Case

Boston – January 26, 2016 -- **Exergen Corporation**, the recognized world leader in medical non-invasive temperature technology, was victorious in its patent infringement trial against Kaz USA, Inc. After two weeks of testimony, the jury returned a verdict in favor of Exergen and awarded damages of \$14.6 million. Exergen was represented by lead attorney Kerry Timbers of Sunstein Kann Murphy & Timbers LLP, a Boston-based intellectual property law firm. After the decision, attorney Timbers remarked, “This is a great victory for Exergen, the people who pioneered the temporal artery thermometer. We demonstrated to the jury that Exergen’s patents were infringed and rebuffed challenges to their validity. This decision provides Exergen with the recognition it deserves as the market innovator and warns competitors against copying its patented inventions. ”
